

Figure A1. Bayesian receiver-operating characteristic (ROC) curve (sensitivity vs. 100 – specificity, or true positive vs. false positive rates; dotted straight line = null baseline) for increasing numbers of factors identified by multivariable regression modeling (Table 3) that significantly and independently identified mood disorder subjects with suicidal acts from those without. The computed area-under-the-curve (AUC) was 71.3% (95% CI: 68.6–74.0). Optimal differentiation of 3284 subjects with vs. without suicidal acts was with at least 2 factors (the point on the ROC curve most displaced from the null line, with sensitivity = 76.0%, specificity = 55.4%, which correctly classified 57.8% of subjects).



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
