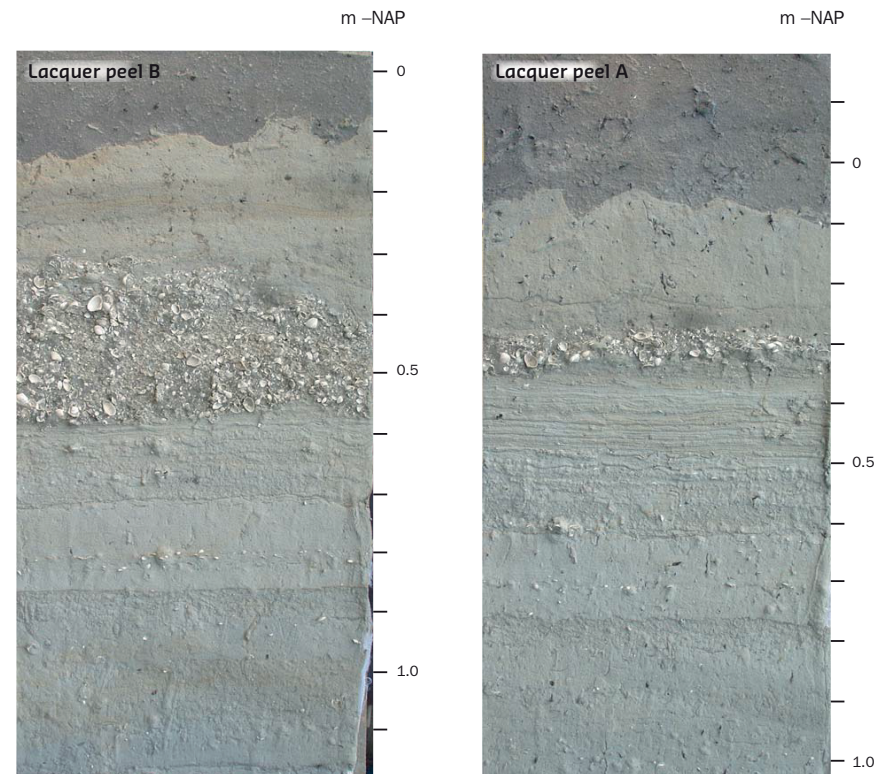


Fig. App. B8. Geoarchaeological survey in the pit Castricum - Zanderij. Location (CZ) is shown in Fig. 3.2.App. B
