SUPPLEMENTARY TABLE 1 Questions, possible responses and scores for the survey on herders' attitudes towards snow leopards and wolves, following the protocol by Suryawanshi et al. (2014). We used the sum of scores for all questions as our measure of herder attitudes, with the attitude scores ranging from -8 (very negative) to +8 (very positive) and 0 being a neutral score. We asked the same questions for snow leopards and wolves; the questions below are from the survey on attitudes towards snow leopards.
