- What kind of habitats do pangolins prefer? Has there been any change in the kind of habitat they inhabit over the years?
- Do you prefer to hunt pangolins over other species? Why or why not?

- Is there a market for wildlife trade? Who buys wildlife products?
- What species are preferred for trade and what species are actually traded?
