This Appendix includes several graphs (Figures A1-A8) and one table (A1) that contain basic findings from a dataset of field experiments published in leading Political Science journals. Our dataset contains 90 articles and 205 authors selected based on word searches in a web scraping tool developed by Wilson and Knutsen (2020). The search tool surveys 27,689 articles that have appeared in the following top outlets: *American Political Science Review*, *American Journal of Political Science*, *British Journal of Political Science*, *Comparative Political Studies*, *Comparative Politics*, *Journal of Politics*, *International Organizations and World Politics*, between 1906 and 2019. The keywords we have used for this selection are ‘FIELD EXPERIMENT,’ ‘RANDOMIZED CONTROL TRIAL,’ ‘RANDOMIZED EXPERIMENT.’ Our data also distinguishes between field experiments and survey/conjoint RCTs conducted online. Table A1 presents the full list of articles.

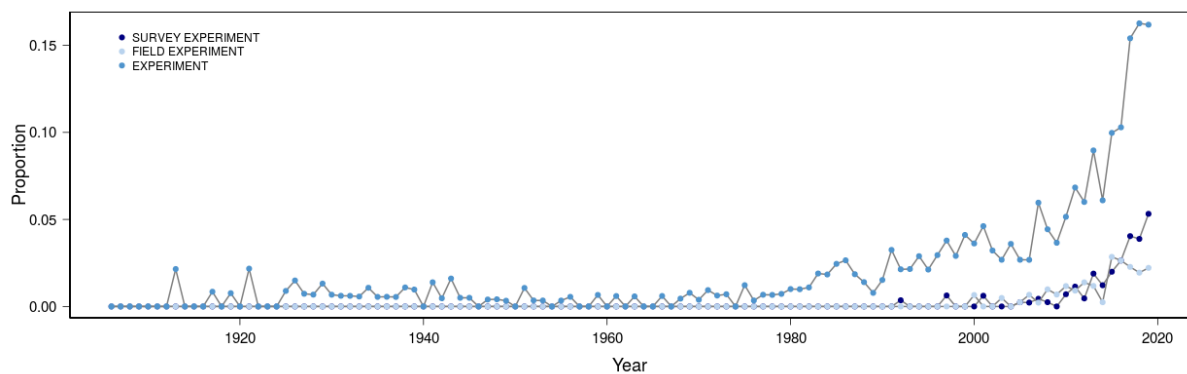


Figure A1: Types of experiments published in top Political Science journals across all subfields (1906-2019)

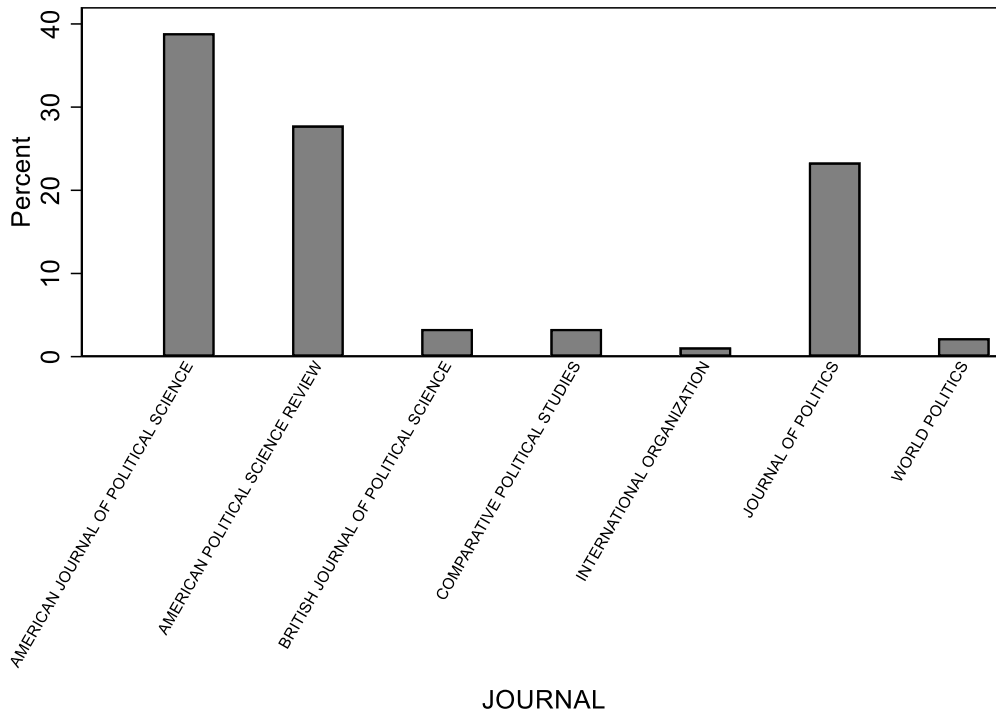


Figure A2: Field experiments published in top Political Science outlets by journal (2000-2019)

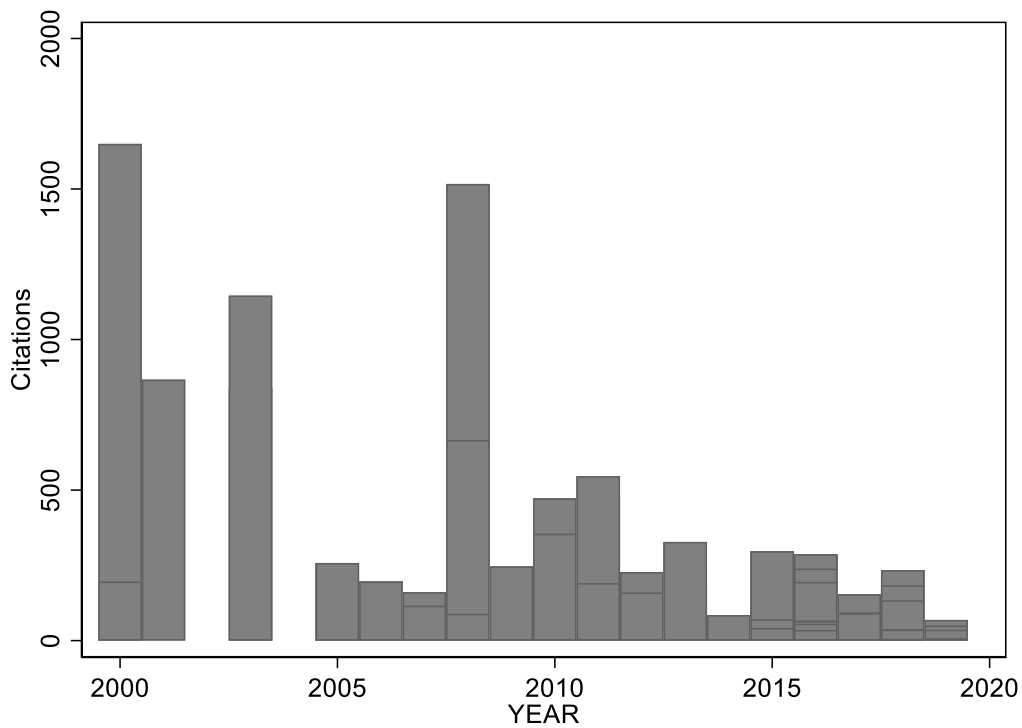


Figure A3: Influence of published articles on field experiments (measured by Google Scholar citations) (2000-2019)

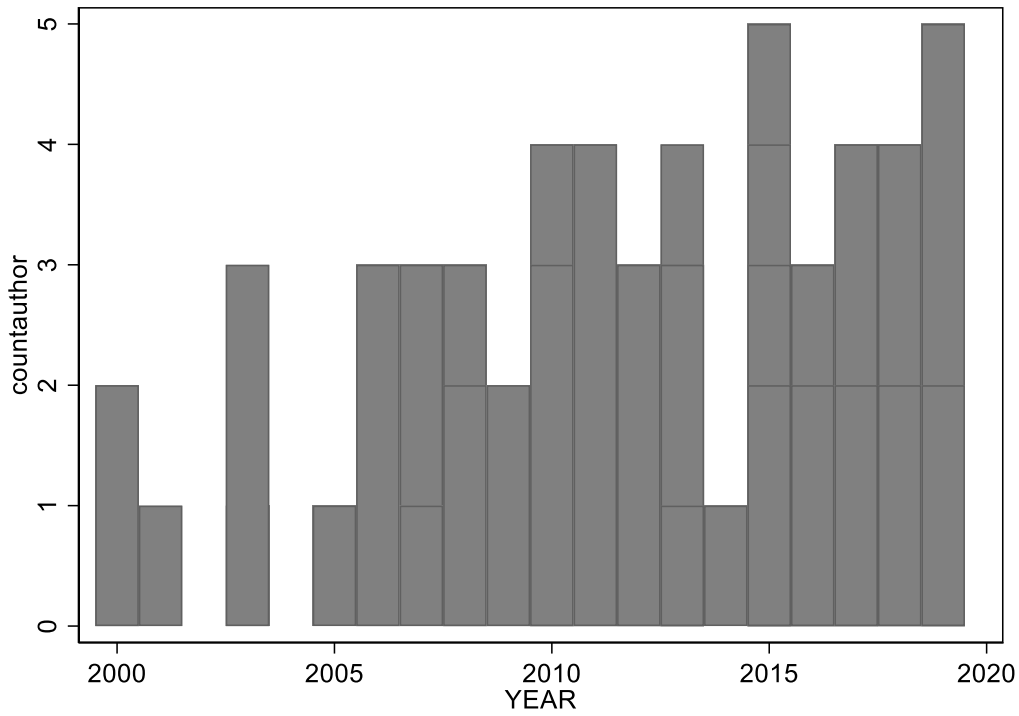


Figure A4: Number of authors of Political Science articles on field experiments (2000-2019)

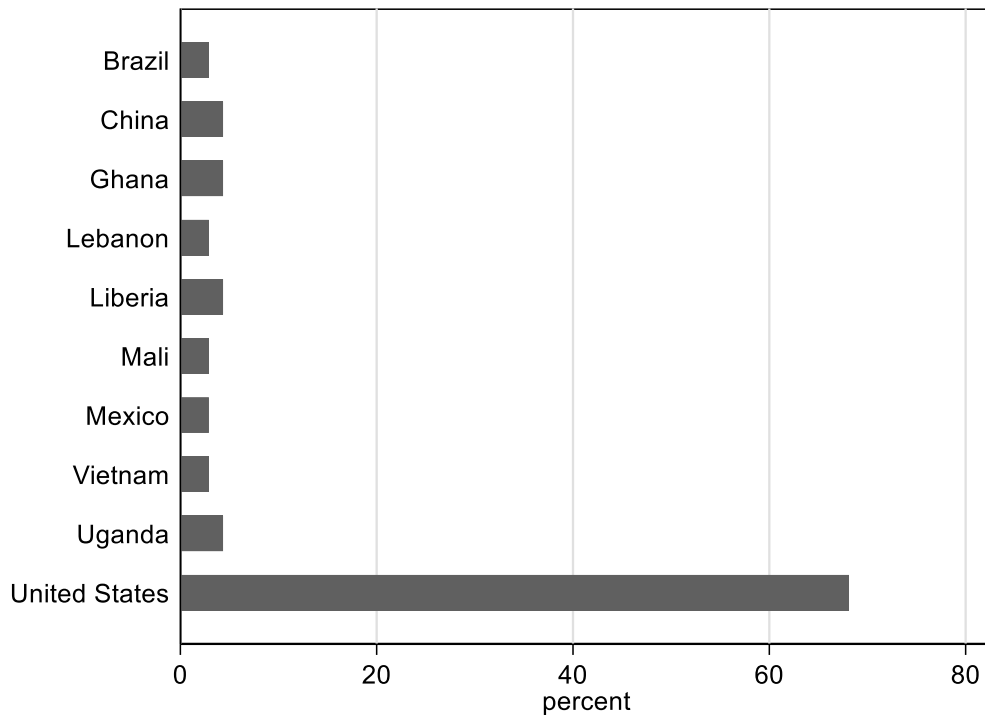


Figure A5: Top 10 countries of experimentation based on publication counts (2000-2019)

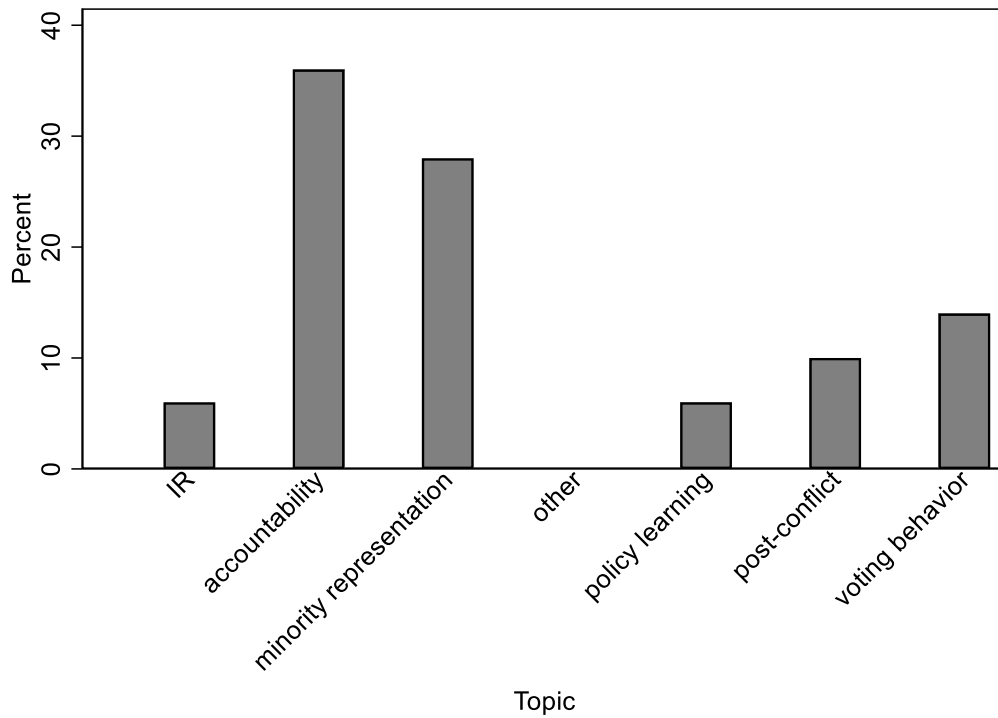


Figure A6: Distribution of topics studied by field experiments published in the leading Political Science publications (2014-2019)

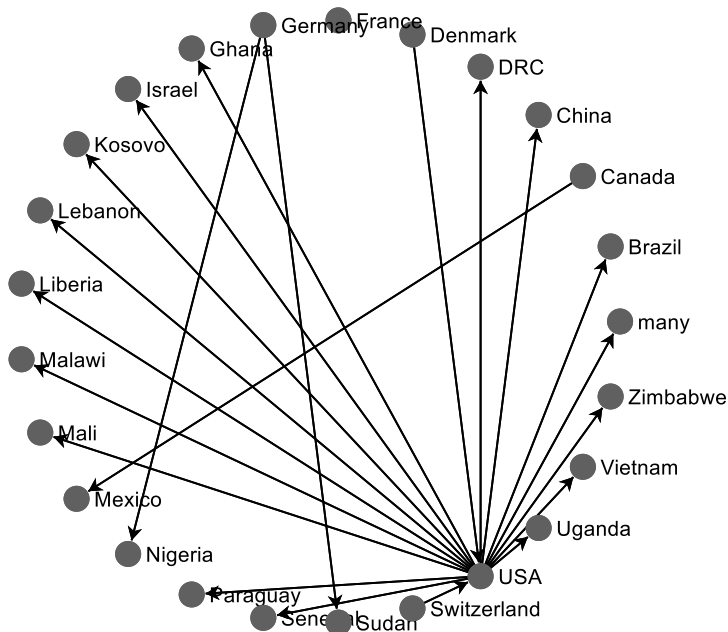


Figure A7: Geographical network of published political science field experiments (2014-2019) [25 nodes; 21 arcs; .035 density; arrows point to the experimental site]

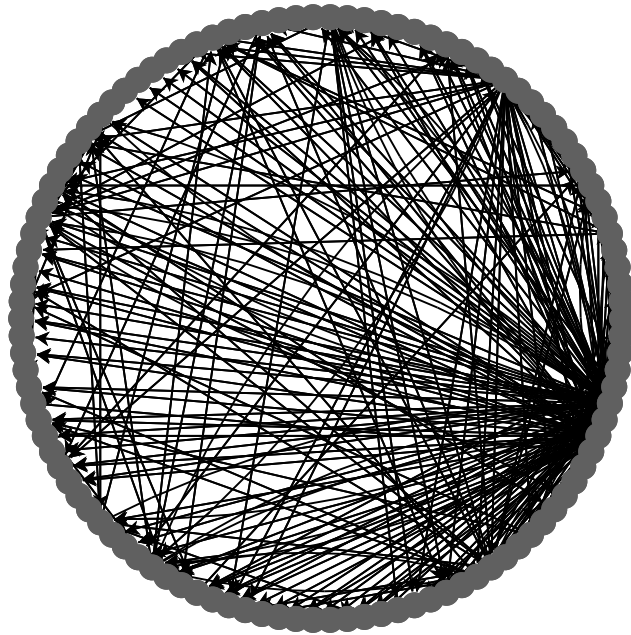
