NOTE: The vote percentages are computed from only those legislators casting a “yea” or “nay” vote on the restrictive voter ID bill. The N in parentheses constitutes all the votes Democrats cast against a restrictive voter ID bill (nays) and all the votes Republicans cast in favor of a restrictive voter ID bill (yeas).

SOURCES: The list of restrictive voter ID legislation is derived from the National Conference of State Legislature’s “History of Voter ID,” last compiled October 16, 2014 and available at: <http://www.ncsl.org/research/elections-and-campaigns/voter-id-history.aspx>. Of the 28 bills analyzed here, based on the NCSL’s coding scheme we classify 17 that created (or would have created) a strict (in **bold**) photo ID requirement. Floor votes are final votes on the legislation, typically a third-reading or the approval of a conference report. The sources for the roll-call votes for both chambers were obtained from Vote Smart (www.votesmart.org) or directly from the official websites maintained by these state legislatures (see Table A2).
