Dr. Schor serves since December 2008 as the Acting Director of the National Center for Disaster Medicine and Public Health and is a civilian faculty member (Assistant Professor), School of Medicine, of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USU).

Dr. Schor received a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine; a Master of Science (with Distinction) from the National Defense University; and a Master of Public Health (MPH) from USU. He has completed graduate medical education in Family Medicine and General Preventive Medicine. His credentials include Diplomate of the American Board of Preventive Medicine and Fellow of the American Academy of Family Physicians.

His 27 years of active duty service in the Navy Medical Corps spans a range of operational, clinical, leadership, policy, and teaching positions. His top three personal medals include the Defense Superior Services Medal, Legion of Merit, and Defense Meritorious Services Medal.
