Manual Coding - Codebook

- Code both the image and the tagline for relevance
 - If deemed relevant, the image and tagline will be further coded with codes listed under “Relevant to Zika Virus” below
 - If relevant, images/taglines can have multiple codes
 - *****DO NOT CODE COMMENTS. Comments are the un-bolded text. Only code taglines. Taglines will be in bold right under a “From [insert website here]”.**
- **Not Relevant to Zika Virus/Does not make sense**
 - Code as not relevant if the pin does not make sense, or if the tagline does not match the image. Videos will also be deemed not relevant.

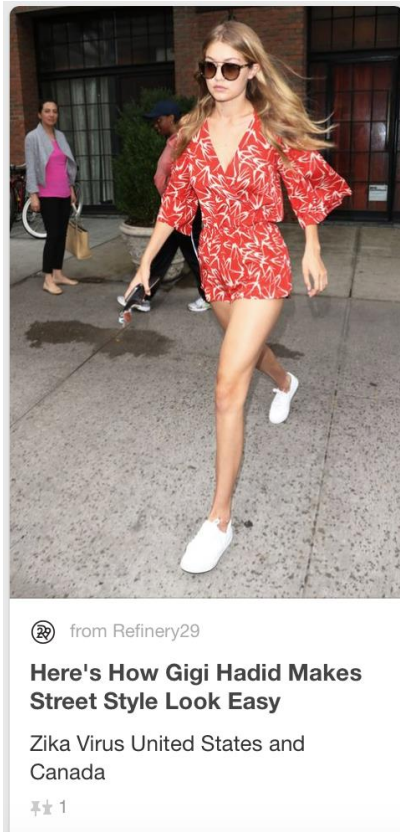


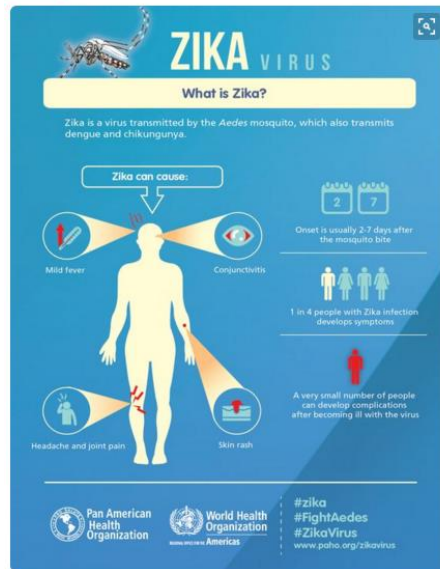

This pin is coded not relevant because it is not actually about the Zika virus - the Tagline and image do not match.

- **Relevant to Zika Virus**

- Symptoms: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses any symptoms, potential symptoms, or believed symptoms of Zika virus.

This pin is coded as “symptoms” because the image portrays potential symptoms of the virus. This pin would also be coded as “transmission” because it discusses transmission of the virus, as well as “active organizations” because the mention of WHO.

- Transmission: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses possible transmission. Includes images/discussions of mosquitos (the vector of Zika Virus). Only applies to discussion of transmission between people and vector. Do not code image/tagline of geographical spread/transmission of virus.

This pin would be coded as transmission because it portrays a mosquito (the vector of Zika virus). This pin would also be coded as “spread of virus” because the tagline discusses the “spread” of zika into the Americas.

- Birth defects: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses a child with microcephaly or other birth defects. Only applies to the living persons.

This pin is coded as “birth defects” because it portrays microcephaly in the image, as well as discusses microcephaly in the tagline. This pin will be coded for active organization as well because it mentions CDC.

- Treatment/Medical: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses treatment, medical care, medically trained officials giving treatment/involved in Zika response.

This pin is coded as “treatment/medical” because the image portrays a child receiving medical care. This pin is also coded as “birth defects” because the tagline discusses microcephaly.

- Pregnancy: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses pregnancy.

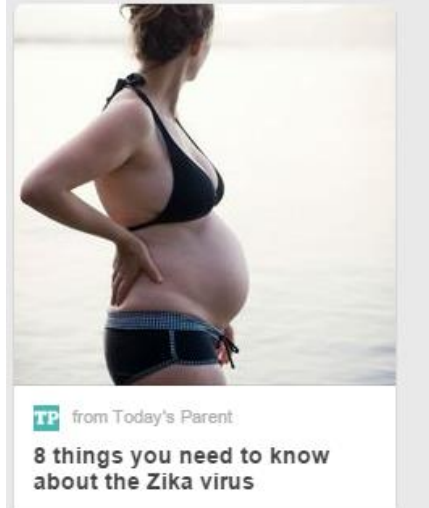

This pin is coded as “pregnancy” because the image portrays a pregnant woman.

- Active Organizations: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses organizations that are active in the Zika Virus response (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), World Health Organization (WHO)), etc.) Includes active organizations from other countries (the ECDC, for example). **The list of applicable active organizations is at the end of this codebook.

This pin is coded as “active organizations” because it mentions the CDC. This pin would also be coded as “travel” because of the tagline’s warning of travel”, and “pregnancy” because the tagline mentions pregnancy.

- Laboratory: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses laboratory testing of Zika virus.

This pin is coded as “laboratory” because it shows testing in a laboratory. This image would also be coded as “birth defects” because the tagline discusses deformities.

- Spread of virus: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses Zika spread to country/geographical area. Also includes if image/tagline portrays/discusses geographical images related to Zika virus (a map with affected areas highlighted, for example).

This pin would be coded as “spread of virus” because it shows the geographical image of the spread of Zika virus and mentions “spread of virus” on the image.

- Prevention: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses prevention against Zika virus (spraying for mosquitos, warning against pregnancy, etc.).

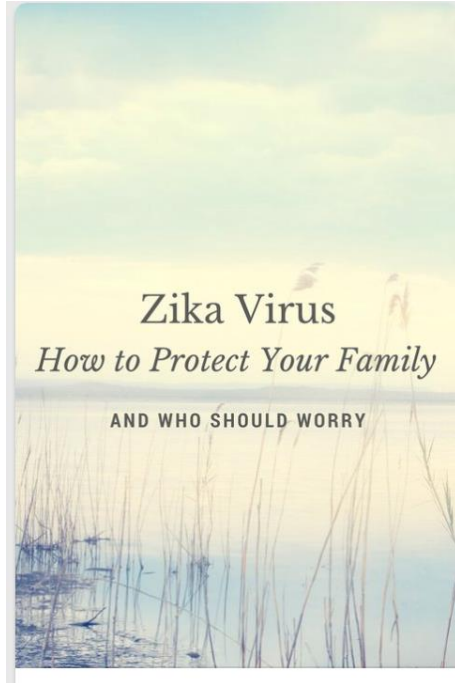

This pin is coded as “prevention” because it discusses how to protect yourself/your family against Zika virus.

- New case(s): Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses a new case, multiple new cases, reports of new case(s), suspected or confirmed.

This pin is coded as “new case(s)” because it mentions 3 new cases reported.

- Death(s): Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses death of baby/mother, abortions, miscarriages. Only applies to death of people.

This pin is coded as “death” because the tagline discusses deaths related to Zika virus.

- Travel: Code if image/tagline portrays/discusses warnings against travel, discusses travelling to affected countries (suspected or confirmed), or affected people traveling (suspected or confirmed).

This pin is coded as “travel” because the tagline discusses what to know about Zika before traveling.

- Miscellaneous: Code if image/tagline is relevant, but cannot be coded into any of the above codes.

This pin is coded as “Miscellaneous” because it does not fall into any of the above codes.
